Finally, they brought the women and children who, thoughtfully, shopped and picked the clothing their families needed.

Budd told me that he also scored a very large donation from a shop that closed, **1,500 coats!** Great items to keep these survivors, of their war torn country alive and warmer in the winter.

Trust in Education, quite a good organization. I don't know how Budd manages to get it done year after year!. What a wonderful thing to give.... education and life. Amazing.
